

Privacy Policy

This privacy notice describes how **Collaborate ('we', 'us')** collects and processes personal information about you; how we use and protect this information, and your rights in relation to this information. This privacy notice applies to all personal information we collect or process about you. Personal information is information, or a combination of pieces of information that could reasonably allow you to be identified.

1. Personal information we use

We will collect personal information from you directly (e.g. when you contact us or when you login to your account using our website) and we collect personal information automatically when you use our website.

The categories of information that we may collect directly from you include the following:

- (a) personal details (e.g. name, age);
- (b) contact details (e.g. work phone number, work email address, work postal address or work mobile number);

The categories of information we may collect automatically about you include information from cookies and other identifiers we place on your device. We only place cookies or other identifiers on your device where they are necessary for the website to function correctly, or if you have provided your consent.

2. How we use your personal information and the basis on which we use it

We may use your personal information for the following purposes:

- *Identification and authentication:* we use your identification information to verify your identity when you login to your account and use our services, and to ensure the security of your personal information. We use your personal information for this purpose so that we can comply with our contractual obligations to you which are set out in the [Terms and Conditions](#).
- *Operating the website:* we process your personal information to provide the website and any services on the website which you have requested. This is so we can provide the services to you in line with our contractual obligations to you, which are set out in the [Terms and Conditions](#).
- *Communicating with you:* we may use any of the categories of your personal information when we communicate with you, for example if we are providing information about changes to the terms and conditions or if you contact us with questions. It is in our legitimate interests that we are able to provide you with appropriate responses and provide you with notice about our services.
- *Marketing:* we may use your personal information to personalize the marketing messages we send to you, to make them more relevant and interesting, as this is in our legitimate business interests. Where necessary, we will obtain your consent first.

3. Your rights over your personal information

You have certain rights regarding your personal information, subject to local law. These include the following rights to:

- access your personal information;
- rectify the information we hold about you;
- erase your personal information;

- restrict our use of your personal information;
- object to our use of your personal information;
- receive your personal information in a usable electronic format and transmit it to a third party (right to data portability); and
- lodge a complaint with your local data protection authority.

We encourage you to contact us to update or correct your information if it changes or if the personal information we hold about you is inaccurate.

Please note that we will likely require additional information from you in order to honour your requests.

If you would like to discuss or exercise such rights, please contact us using the details set out below.

4. Information Sharing

We may share your personal information with our business partners if you “opt in” to receive information on their services.

5. Retention of Personal Information

We will retain your personal information so that we can invite you to future events and send you messages about our activities. We will delete your personal information after a certain period if you do not make contact with us or attend any of our events. When deciding how long to keep your personal information after our relationship with you has ended, we take into account our legal obligations and regulators’ expectations. We may also retain records to investigate or defend potential legal claims.
